



Celebrating Louie’s Legacy



As family and friends of the Live for Lou Fund look back on the past nine years, we fondly contemplate the lives positively affected by your donations. With over \$135,000 donated over that nine year span, LFL has given to a variety of sobriety initiatives, such as Structured Outpatient Addition Support at OuterCape Health Services and local scholars pursuing addition counseling education.

This year we expanded our giving parameters based on a heartfelt email from a board member and friend, “Addiction affects the entire family. Due to addiction's impact, many of our families rely on the support provided by Katelynn's Closet [...]. Katelynn's Closet provides clothing (for all seasons, [and] to that end, I am asking that LFL make a donation to allow Katelynn's Closet to continue to support Cape Cod kids.” We began thinking out of the box, and this year gave \$7,000 to three different charities, all focusing on the family and health: Cape Cod Children’s Place , Katelynn’s Closet, and WellStrong. The three pillars on which Live for Lou is based consist of beauty, compassion, and athleticism. The below organizations represent compassion and athleticism, and because of you, Live for Lou has donated or pledged over \$135,000:

...\$55,000 to **OuterCape Health Services** for the Wellfleet Health Center, as well as their Office-Based Addiction Treatment (OBAT), Structured Outpatient Addiction Program (SOAP), and Recovery Coaches Initiatives.

...\$45,000 to local scholars pursuing **addiction counseling education** and returning to the Cape for their career, as well as high school graduates continuing to participate in athletics entering freshmen year of college.

...\$19,000 to **Gosnold for the Miller House** (Sober Living), Recovery Coaches, and Insurance Deductibles.

...\$7,500 to the **Community Development Partnership** for Client Placement at the Canal House (Sober Living).

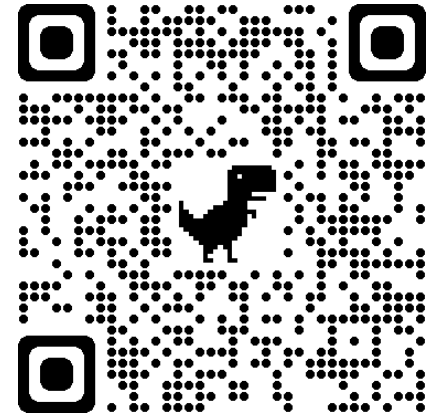
...\$4,350 to **Nauset Regional High School**, Louie’s alma mater, for their new Turf Project.

...\$1,000 to **WellStrong**, a fitness and wellness community on Cape Cod for people in recovery.

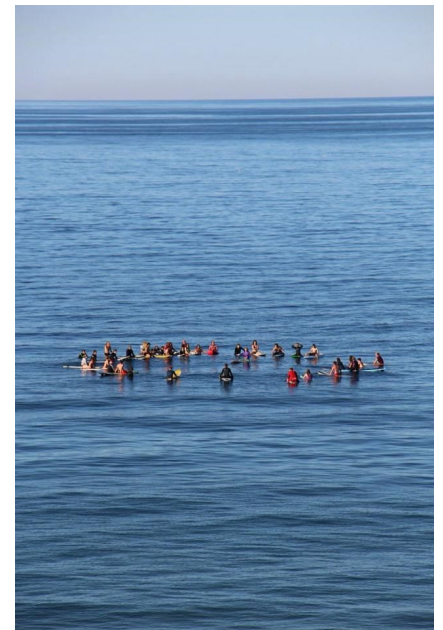
